Course Title: The Art of Lotus in Chinese Brush Painting

Felix Chan Lim has participated in more than 165 art exhibits and has conducted more than 130 lectures and painting workshops on Chinese brush painting for nearly four decades. He was an associate professor in painting for more than 10 years, and his paintings are in private collections around the world.

Bobbi Makani-Lim has taught Chinese brush painting for many years and has organized several Asian-themed art exhibitions. She has been actively involved in developing teaching methods and courses related to Chinese culture and the arts.

Course Summary

This course introduces students to the art and philosophy of painting the lotus. The course will focus on learning the fundamentals of painting and developing skills and techniques for painting the lotus flower using the Chinese brush. It is a hands-on, skills-development course where students will learn different techniques for painting the lotus flower. Most of the class sessions will be devoted to actual painting and application of techniques learned in class. The course does not require any previous knowledge in painting.

Students who require letter grades will be rated based on their improvements and actual work submitted in class. There may be a class exhibit during the last week of classes.

Grade Options and Requirements

- No Grade Requested (NGR)
 - This is the default option. No work will be required; no credit shall be received; no proof of attendance can be provided.
- Credit/No Credit (CR/NC)
 - Score will be determined by student attendance and participation.
 - Students who require "Credit" Grade will need to attend at least 4 sessions, and join the class exhibit.
- Letter Grade (A, B, C, D, No Pass)
 - Submitted artwork, as assigned by the instructor, will determine a student's grade.
 - Students requiring a "Letter" Grade will need to attend at least 5 sessions, submit 2 art pieces on the lotus as a subject, and join the class exhibit.

Textbooks/Required Materials

No textbooks are required for this course. All materials will be posted on Canvas. Students will be responsible for their own painting materials. Please expect to spend between \$40-\$60 for materials.

First Assignment

Please have the following ready by the first day of class:

- 1) One big Chinese Paint Brush (~1.5 inch or longer brush length)
- 2) One small Chinese Paint Brush (around 1 inch brush length)
- 3) Watercolor or Tempera (assorted colors) OR Chinese ink
- 4) Mixing plate
- 5) Small water cup/container (preferably with a wide base to avoid tipping over)
- 6) Newsprint paper (any size)
- 7) Old newspapers (for covering your tables and minimize cleanup)
